



BSC Bratislava wins the U15 tournament

The eleventh tournament of the U15 category took place in Brandýs nad Labem. In the even matches, the Slovak team BSC Bratislava showed the best nerves, winning gold medals.

The home team of the tournament is BK VIVIDBOOKS Pardubice, which won gold medals at the last tournament on the field of its first opponent in the tournament PGE Giek Turów Zgorzelec. Beksa manages this duel and claims its first victory in the tournament. In the second match, the Slovak team BSC Bratislava wins over the German team VR Bank Würzburg Akademie. In the third match, we will have the first surprise of the tournament, when Beksa is not enough for another Polish team UKS MOS Opole. It is quite a shock, especially when Beksa loses by a difference of thirty points.

On Saturday morning, the "shaken" Beksa loses another match, this time against the German team. The loss is after a balanced match, but still by nine points. Beksa's ruin in this tournament is complete in the afternoon match with BSC, when the Czech team held on to the match for three quarters, but in the last quarter they fell to a double-digit deficit, which they could not erase and they lost again. On Saturday, BSC played a balanced match with the Polish team from Opole, they were ahead by several points throughout the match and defended their win by five points in the end. Zgorzelec was also a balanced opponent for the other teams in the tournament, although they ultimately did not take any wins from the tournament. On Saturday, the German team felt its quality, which had to fight hard for its victory in this match.

On Sunday, the German VR Bank Würzburg Akademie defeated the Polish team UKS MOS Opole. Thanks to this, they won silver, leaving the Polish team with bronze. In the last match of the tournament, the Slovak team BSC Bratislava defeated the Polish team PGE Giek Turów Zgorzelec and confirmed the gold medals.
