



PGE Spójnia ZS 2 Stargard wins the U16 tournament

The seventh tournament of the U16 category took place in Žďár nad Sázavou. The Polish team PGE Spójnia ZS 2 Stargard showed the best performances and won gold medals, thus qualifying for The Finals U16.

Friday's program began with a match between the home team Vlci Žďár nad Sázavou and the Polish team PGE Spójnia ZS 2 Stargard. The home team performed well in the first half of the match and maintained an acceptable score difference. The second half belonged to Stargard, who took control of the match and eventually won by more than thirty points. The second match of the tournament was in the Slovak-Czech mode between the teams Dynamo Bratislava EXTRA and BK Brandýs nad Labem. Here the course was similar. Dynamo played a decent first half, but the second half belonged entirely to Brandýs, who ultimately won by a difference of twenty-two points. In the last match of the first round of the tournament, the Polish team AK Ożarów gradually increased their lead over the German team ESV Ingolstadt Ringsee and ultimately won by thirty points. An even match started the afternoon program, where the Wolves really bit into the Dynamo players' "furs" from the beginning and led by twenty points at half-time. However, Dynamo did not give up and the home team had to fight hard for their victory in the end. They managed to get it by a difference of nine points.

And the Wolves are enjoying other tense moments on Saturday's program. When they play an exciting and physically very demanding match with the Polish team AK Ożarów. The whole match is extremely combative and balanced and reaches an even ending supported by a stormy home crowd. We get to the moment when the home team leads by one point and the opponent goes on the attack, where they finish with a difficult three-point shot in a pinch. And since the home team loses the ball in the following two attacks in a short succession, the Polish team rejoices in the victory by two points. In the next match, we can watch the "final" match of the tournament between Stargard and Brandýs. The Czech team faced enormous pressure in the first quarter and scored thirty points, which is definitely not a sign of a quality defense. After this shock, Brandýs improved its game and at halftime the difference in the score was an acceptable twelve points. The second half of the match belongs to the Polish team, and despite the great resistance of Brandýs, they won by thirteen points.

On Sunday, the program opens with a match between Ożarów and Stargard. And the latter team will dominate the match and, thanks to this win, confirm the gold medal. Ożarów's position in the standings is still unclear. The second match between Ingolstadt and Dynamo is fully under control of the Slovak team, which wins a big win. The tournament closes with a match between the home team and Brandýs. The result of this match will decide the second to fourth place. Due to the win of Brandýs, which confirms the silver medal, Ożarów moves to the bronze position. The home team is left with the unpopular "potato" medal.
